

The rains have been coming in and the lake level is rising we are already above last year's high water level. Hopefully we will get a few more storms to raise the lake level even higher. Along with the rising water comes floating debris logs, tree branches and trash. The harvester and volunteers have been cleaning up the canals. As a reminder each homeowner needs to take responsibility for their property to keep trees and trash from floating into our canals and not to rely on the POA. It is not the POA's responsibility to do the job for them. The volunteers have been cleaning out the weeds and debris with the harvester and most of the canals look good. We will continue our efforts. The channel restoration survey votes have been counted and the majority of the votes were NO. Do to the lack of interest in the dredging of our canals the dredging project will be suspended indefinitely. It's disappointing we don't have enough people that care about cleaning out our canals and helping restore some of our property values.

Doug Smith is putting together a proposal for purchasing a 2nd harvester to help with the work load. The harvester was hardly used due to low water but both paddle wheel motors had to be pulled and repaired and both seals had to be replaced on the front conveyer system and several repairs were made to the motor. The good news is the harvester is working fine. The new harvester will be on the agenda for the March 28th general meeting. Our webmaster has added a new link on the POA website to look at the current lake levels from the USGS site. Just click and check the lake's water levels. If you still haven't done this yet please go to the POA home page and opt-in to be emailed neighborhood watch alert



notices and POA notifications. This will help keep you up to date on what is happening in the keys. The POA is still sending out around 330 newsletters by mail we need to get that figure down as close to zero as possible. Please go to the POA websites home page and opt-in to receive the POA newsletter by email this will help to save on mailing expenses. The POA is looking for someone to take over the treasurer position. It would be helpful to have some experience in accounting or bookkeeping and have some good organizational skills. The new treasurer will be trained prior to taking over the position .If anyone is interested in the position or has any questions please call Sandy Magnan. Doug Smith has resigned as admiral due to having to spend more time in the bay area. The POA is looking for someone to take over the Admiral position. It would be helpful to be a people person with good organization skills. Some of the duties of the admiral will be to organize crews to operate the spray boats and harvester, maintain the fleet in good working order and put together work details to remove debris from the waterways. Doug Smith will assist with some of the duties of the admiral. If anyone is interested in the admiral position please contact Doug Smith or Joe Stella.

Some good news, I believe we have rounded the corner on the foreclosures, but still have about 35 total properties with liens for unpaid assessments. To date we have approximately 85% of individual properties showing the assessment for this year has been paid. Reminder late notices have gone out and additional payments are coming in. The POA is in pretty good financial shape with a couple years of lower than usual expenses for algae control and water levels that precluded the equipment from being able to be deployed for various times throughout the last season. We have had active discussions on the possible purchase of a new harvester to be used in addition to the existing harvester with features that allow it to be available for use in lower water levels and for longer periods during the year when the current harvester should be removed from the water to help lengthen its useful life. Financing such a project if it moves forward will be a challenge, but looking into the possibilities.

Another interesting project the Board is currently working on logistics, is the installation of security cameras at various intersections throughout the Keys. We continue to look for more ways to help keep our neighborhoods safer.

A reminder to all POA members, we are an all-volunteer organization including your Board, Spray boat operators and helpers, Harvester operators, Neighborhood Watch, event organizers and Volunteer coordinators. So when you see those spray boats and the harvester out and about in the canals or come across any of the volunteers listed in the member insert—remember to thank them for giving up of their time to help make this a better place to live and visit. But, as an all-volunteer organization, please remember we need your help too. This year has started off as a busy year. With the usual weeds, we are also experiencing more than average debris, such as logs, branches, and dock floats. I, personally, have noticed tree branches and logs that have been cut purposely with chainsaws and have found their way into the canals. As a reminder for all homeowners, homeowners are responsible for their shoreline. That includes trees and boat docks.

As for the harvester, repair work has been performed, and currently is being operated in all zones. We have also begun training more volunteers to run the equipment. Anyone interested in contributing to waterway maintenance, may contact Joe or myself to set up training, and if you are a previous volunteer, we would appreciate any volunteer help you would be willing to provide.

Work was performed on two of our spray boats and they are now ready to go. Special thanks to Steve Abel for overhauling the motor on Spray boat #4, and to all our volunteers that have selflessly devoted their time to our equipment, channels, the POA board, etc.

Finally, for some time, the Board has been looking into purchasing a new Harvester. The reliability issues our antiquated harvester has had for many years, is the main reason for a second harvester. However, there are additional benefits. A second, smaller, harvester would be available during the days, weeks, or months the old harvester is out for repairs and will also lighten our existing harvester's workload. The new harvester will also have an upgraded stainless steel hull the old harvester does not have, allowing it to be kept in the water for year round availability. It has the capability to pick up smaller debris, such as Duck weed, our current harvester is not equipped for, and will get into tight areas the larger one cannot.

Although a lot has been accomplished with the select volunteer group we currently have, it is crucial for our community to have additional volunteers. We welcome you all and ANY contribution is helpful. Not only is it for the betterment of our community, but is a fantastic way to build friendships and good rapport with neighbors we might never have met. 
